Dr. Bobby Austin is an award-winning author, editor, educator, and a former foundation president. He was the founding editor of the Urban League Review and served as host of the national internet radio program "American Voices." As the director of the National Taskforce on African American Men and Boys funded by the Kellogg Foundation, he co-authored and edited the pivotal report Repairing the Breach. ABOUT THE PROGRAM

With the power of creativity, FACT aims to unlock the creative talents of families, strengthen ties among neighbors, and help families use art to voice the hopes and dreams they have for themselves and their neighborhood. FACT is all about how families can use art to learn and create together, craft new neighborhood stories, and lead positive change in the community. In the program, you will learn and practice artistic skills that build communication and collaboration. Activities include: drawing portraits of another person's vision of themselves; taking photographs that capture the neighborhood's spirit; and telling stories about the dreams you have for yourself, your family, and your neighborhood.

COST & SAFETY

FACT is free to residents of City View Park, Bradenton Village, Jervay Place, and National Housing Trust communities including all art supplies. All FACT instructors have passed thorough state and federal criminal background checks.

WHERE WE'LL MEET

FACT comes to you! Virtual art class sessions are held in Louisville, KY, Bradenton, FL, Wilmington, NC, and Washington, D.C. powered by ZOOM. Enrichment Activities will be worked out in advance during Summer 2021 in consideration of COVID19 safety precautions. Activities include field trips and guest speakers.

WHAT WE'LL DO

Units 1-3 and Unit Reflection of FACT offer several arts-based family bonding activities, we'll cover each Unit (10 sessions) in 10 weeks meeting virtually once a week. All families who participate in Fall, Winter, Spring, or Summer FACT art classes will come together virtually for an interactive art exhibit that celebrates the artwork they made throughout the year.

- ★ Unit 1: how to draw pictures of your family to tell stories about your family;
- ★ Unit 2: how to use photographs to tell stories about community and your life;
- ★ Unit 3: how to use your experiences and words to craft a community story.
- ★ Virtual Art Exhibit: how to create a virtual art exhibit. FACT provides various interactive platforms to launch it!
- ★ Time & Dates: All sessions and workshops are hosted virtually. (1hour duration) Please see online Schedule

This program is not meant to be daycare. > Adults, please bring whatever items you and your family will need to be comfortable for 3 hours. > Kindly share your contact information for class reminders and schedule changes. > Please provide an emergency contact for yourself and your children attending classes. > Please let us know about special needs, such as food allergies or restrictions. > Always feel free to ask us questions. The only bad questions are those not asked. > Always feel free to bring in your own artwork to share with the class!
- > Kindly review and complete the media release forms. With your permission, we'd like to include pictures and videos from class to tell the story of the program in our publications.
